### **Description:**

PORTABLE ABRASIVE BLASTING UNIT #2 consisting of: Everblast Model WJ-7 7/16" I.D. water injection nozzles and a Schmidt Axxiom 10 CF wet/dry blaster, Serial No. 24LX-17312. This unit is powered either by a portable air compressor (49 bhp) or plant air, producing a nozzle pressure of 100 PSIG. The abrasive blasting operation consists of 80% wet/20% dry abrasive blasting (final finish) of concrete panels.

### **CONDITIONS:**

- 1. This equipment shall be installed, operated and maintained in strict accord with those recommendations of the manufacturer/supplier and/or sound engineering principles which produce the minimum emissions of contaminants.

- 2. Operation of this equipment shall be conducted in compliance with data and specifications submitted with the application under which this permit is issued unless otherwise noted below.

- 3. Abrasive blasting operations shall only use wet abrasive blasting or abrasives CARB certified for permissible dry outdoor blasting. [District Rule 1302; 17 CCR 92000]
- 4. The owner/operator shall maintain a log which contains at a minimum the following information. The log shall be maintained current, on-site for a minimum of two years and provided to District, State or Federal personnel on request.
- a. Type of abrasive blast material used, including whether the abrasive blast media is wet or dry;
- b. Date and duration (in hours) of use (summarized annually) or monthly total of blast media consumed (summarized annually); and
- c. Percent of total operating time wet blasting is conducted at this facility;

- 5. This facility shall comply with District Rules 401 (with the exception of condition 7), 402, and 403, which corresponds to Visible Emissions, Nuisance, and Fugitive Dust, respectively.
- 6. All abrasive blasting operations conducted at this facility shall comply with Title 17 California Code of Regulations sections 92000-92530.
- 7. Open outdoor abrasive blasting shall not discharge into the atmosphere visible emission that exhibits greater than forty (40) percent opacity.

[17 CCR 92200 - supersedes Rule 401]

- 8. Units A013188, A013193, and A013414 shall not operate more than a combined total of 5400 hours per year or consume more than 2444 tons per year of abrasive blast media.

- 9. Wet abrasive blasting operations shall account for 80% of all abrasive blasting operations at this facility. [District Rule 1302; 17 CCR 92520]
- 10. The owner/operator shall take all reasonable measures to control dust and prevent the release of particulate matter from abrasive blasting operations These include but are not limited to the following;
- a. Daily cleanup of the abrasive blast area; and
- b. During high wind events which cause dust to become released, owner/operator must stop blasting until conditions improve or the owner/operator apply's enough additional control measures to prevent a release. [District Rule 1302]
- 11. A facility wide Comprehensive Emission Inventory (CEI) for all emitted criteria and toxic air pollutants must be submitted to the District, in a format approved by the District, upon District request.
