COAL UNLOADING SYSTEM consisting of: Railroad car, unloading hoppers #1 and #2, belt feeders (ffb2bf and ffb1bf), diverter chute (fbc12gc), belt conveyors (fbc12, fbc13), stacker reclaimer (fbc13S) and drag chain (fbc13sdc).

CONDITIONS:

1. Materials processed shall contain sufficient natural moisture to ensure compliance with Rule 401, 402, and 403. Water equipment to properly wet dried out material being processed shall be maintained in operable condition on the site and used as necessary to assure compliance.

1. The owner/operator (o/o) shall maintain this equipment in strict accord with those recommendations of the manufacturer/supplier and/or sound engineering principles which produce the minimum emissions of air contaminants.

Determination of whether acceptable operating and maintenance procedures are being used will be based on information available to the Administrator (District) which may include, but is not limited to, monitoring results, opacity observations, review of operating and maintenance procedures, and inspection of the source. 7.All opacity readings shall be conducted per EPA Method 9. [40 CFR 60 Subpart Y]

8.Owner/operator shall conduct all performance tests required by 40 CFR 60 Subpart A Subsection 60.8 to demonstrate compliance

with the applicable emission standards using the methods identified in 40 CFR 60 Subpart Y Subsection 60.257.

9.A facility wide Comprehensive Emission Inventory (CEI) for all emitted criteria and toxic air pollutants must be submitted to the District, in a format approved by the District, upon District request.
