Description:

DIESEL IC ENGINE, PORTABLE GENERATOR consisting of: USEPA Tier 3 (or higher). This unit is a rental unit and may be substituted with other like rental units as long as they meet at a minimum USEPA Tier 3 emission standards.

One John Deere (or equivalent), Diesel fired internal combustion engine Model No. Rental and Serial No. Rental, After Cooled, Turbo Charged, producing 286 bhp with 6 cylinders at 1800 rpm while consuming a maximum of 14.8 gal/hr. This equipment powers a John Deere (or equivalent) Generator Model No. Rental and Serial No. Rental, rated at 215 kW.

2.This portable diesel IC engine shall be a USEPA Tier 3 (or higher) as evidenced by manufacturer nameplate data.

[17 CCR 93116; District Rule 1303]

3.This engine shall not operate for more than 3,640 hours in any consecutive 12 month period. Additionally, this unit shall not operate more than 13.5 hours per day (midnight to midnight). Before these limitations can be increased, the facility is required to submit to the District an application to modify the permit, which may trigger BACT review and may necessitate a Health Risk Assessment (HRA). In addition, public notice and/or a commenting period may be required.

[District Rules 1302, 1303, and 1320]

4.This facility must not emit more than 14.9 tons of PM₁₀ in any consecutive twelve month period to remain below the offset threshold. This limitation applies to the entire CalPortland - Baxter Iron Mine facility. Prior to exceeding this emission limitation, the owner/operator must submit an application to modify all permitted equipment located at this facility to evaluate emissions offsets as required by District Rule 1303(B). The current emission limitation may not be exceeded without District-approved modified permits.

5.This engine and its associated equipment cannot be operated at the same engine-print (spot) for more than 365 consecutive days, excluding time spent at a designated storage site. This equipment must be moved within this facility or moved to another facility for a valid business purpose annually.

[District Rules 1302, 1303, and 1320 and Title 17 CCR 93116.2(a)(29)]

6.A non-resettable four-digit (9,999) hour timer shall be installed and maintained on this unit to indicate elapsed engine operating time.

[17 CCR 93116.4(b)(2)(A)]

7.This unit shall only be fired on ultra-low sulfur diesel fuel whose sulfur concentration is less than or equal to 0.0015% (15 ppm) on a weight per weight basis per CARB Diesel or equivalent requirements; or alternative diesel fuel, or CARB diesel fuel utilizing fuel additives, that has been verified through the Verification Procedure for In-Use Strategies to Control Emissions from Diesel Engines.

8.The owner/operator shall maintain an operations log for this unit current and on-site (or at a central location) for a minimum of two (2) years, and this log shall be provided to District, State and Federal personnel upon request. The log shall include, at a minimum, the information specified below:

- a. Date, location (lat/long or UTM), and duration of each use (in hours);
- b. Monthly and rolling 12 month summation of operation in terms of fuel consumption (in gallons) and/or total hours;
- c. Monthly and rolling 12 month summations of total facility-wide PM₁₀ emissions;
- d. Fuel sulfur concentration (the o/o may use the supplier's certification of sulfur content if it is maintained as part of this log); and,
- e. Summary that identifies each portable engine in the owner's fleet and the associated emission rate (g/bhp-hr).

[District Regulation XIII - NSR]

9.The owner/operator has elected to and shall comply with the Tier Phase Out option for Large Fleet provision of the Portable Diesel ATCM (17 CCR 93116). The owner/operator shall comply with this provision by ensuring that each applicable engine under the owner/operators common ownership or control is removed from service in accordance with schedule provided in 17 CCR 93116.3(c)(1)(A).

10.This unit is subject to the requirements of the Airborne Toxic Control Measure (ATCM) for Portable Compression Ignition Engines (Title 17 CCR 93116). In the event of conflict between these conditions and the ATCM, the more stringent requirements shall govern.

11.These engines shall not be used within 1,000 feet (304.8 meters) of any K-12 school, residence, hospital, or other sensitive receptor location. Sensitive receptor locations include, but are not limited to, hospitals, schools, and day care centers, and such other locations

as the District board or California Air Resources Board may determine.

12.A facility wide Comprehensive Emission Inventory (CEI) for all emitted criteria and toxic air pollutants must be submitted to the District, in a format approved by the District, upon District request.
