**Description:**

BAGHOUSE, CONCRETE BATCH PLANT consisting of: a Belgrade Steel Tank Pulse Jet Dust Collector, Model # 330, having 6 cartridges made of spun bond polyester, with a total filter area 330 sq. ft. and an Air to Cloth Ratio of 4.8:1. Dust collector has a design maximum flow rate of 1600 ACFM. Unit is rated at controlling PM with a design efficiency of 99.9%.

**CONDITIONS:**

1. The owner/operator (o/o) shall maintain this baghouse in strict accord with those recommendations of the manufacturer/supplier and/or sound engineering principles which produce the minimum emissions of air contaminants. Unless otherwise noted below, operation of this equipment shall be conducted in compliance with all data and specifications submitted with the application under which this permit is issued.

2. This air pollution control device must operate concurrent with the cement transfers and mixers under District Permit B014591 (CONCRETE BATCH PLANT, ARCHITECTURAL).

3. Visible emissions from this equipment shall not exceed an opacity equal to, or greater than, twenty percent (20%) for a period aggregating more than three (3) minutes in any one (1) hour, excluding uncombined water vapor [District Rule 401]. This equipment shall not discharge air contaminants or materials constituting a nuisance to any considerable number of persons or to the public [District Rule 402]. Roadways, work areas and stockpiles shall be kept sufficiently moist to control fugitive dust, and no visible emissions shall extend beyond the property line of the emission source [District Rule 403]. Equipment to properly wet the material being processed shall be maintained in operable condition on-site and used as necessary to assure compliance with this condition.

4. The owner/operator shall conduct monthly inspections of the bag filters, the filter suspension system, the enclosure seals, and the pulsing system to ensure there are no leaks and that the pulsing system is functioning properly.

5. The o/o shall conduct a minimum program of inspection and maintenance on this equipment. The o/o shall maintain current and on-site for two (2) years a log of the following information, which shall be provided to District personnel upon request:

- a. Date of bag replacements;
- b. Results of all monthly inspections as required by Condition 4;
- c. Date and nature of any system repairs.

6. This equipment shall only discharge to sealed containers.

7. This equipment does not require a regularly scheduled emission compliance test. However, emission compliance testing may be required at the discretion of the District.

8. A facility wide Comprehensive Emission Inventory (CEI) for all emitted criteria and toxic air pollutants must be submitted to the District, in a format approved by the District, upon District request.
