Description:

INTERNAL PIPE BLASTING (CLEANING) EQUIPMENT consisting of: Selmers Abrasive Blaster, including a 114 hp wheel capable of throwing 1100 pounds of abrasive per minute. Blasting media shall be CARB approved steel shot and/or grit. Equipment located within a building vented to three Donaldson Dust collectors, Model numbers DF04-64, 4DF-80, and TDP 675 operating under District Permits C010045, C010049, and C014639, respectively.

CONDITIONS:

1. This equipment shall be installed, operated and maintained in strict accord with those recommendations of the manufacturer/supplier and/or sound engineering principles which produce the minimum emissions of contaminants. Operation of this equipment shall be conducted in compliance with data and specifications submitted with the application under which this permit is issued unless otherwise noted below.

2. The abrasive blast enclosure (building) shall not be operated unless vented to functioning air pollution control device(s) operating under valid District Permit(s) C010045, C010049 and/or C014639.

3. The abrasive blast enclosure (building) must be equipped with tight fitting seals around all openings, such as doors, windows, seams, etc., so as to prevent the escape of particulate material to the ambient air while in use.

[District Rules 401, 403; BACT]

4. This unit shall only use steel shot abrasive media exempt from certification requirements of the California Air Resources Board (CARB).

[District Regulation XIII; basis cumulative increase]

5. Emissions from abrasive blasting operations shall not exceed the following visible emission limits for a period or periods aggregating more than three minutes in any one hour:

a) Blasting operations conducted within a permanent building - 10 percent opacity.

[District Rule 401 and 17 CCR 92200; Note: More stringent limit based on District Rule 1303(B), offsets]

6. This abrasive blasting equipment must be operated such that no visible fugitive dust is visible in the atmosphere beyond the property line of the facility at which this equipment is operating.

[District Rule 403(a)]

7. This Permit Unit shall not blast more than 3,600,591 square feet of pipe in any 12-month consecutive period (limit correlates to 85 pounds of PM10 per year).

[District Rule 1303(B), basis: offsets]

8. A daily operations log for this equipment shall be maintained on-site for at least five (5) years and made available to Federal, State, and/or District personnel upon request. This log shall contain, at a minimum:

a) Date and amount of each pipe blasted (square feet), and hours of each equipment use;

b) Consecutive 12-month total of pipe blasted (square feet); and,

c) Date, type and amount of abrasive added to this equipment, including proof of CARB certification(s).

[District Rules 1302 and 1303(B)]

9. This facility has elected to voluntarily limit its emissions to the extent that this facility is no longer subject to the provisions of Regulation XII - Federal Operating Permits [District Rule 221(B)]. As such, the facility-wide emissions must be less than the following limitations:

a) 80 tons per year of Carbon Monoxide (CO) per calendar year;

b) 20 tons per year of Oxides of Nitrogen (NOx) per calendar year;

c) 25 tons per year of Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) per each consecutive twelve-month period (synthetic minor designation);

d) 80 tons per year of Particulate Matter of 10 microns or less (PM10) per calendar year;

e) 20 tons per year of Oxides of Sulfur (SOx) per calendar year;

f) 8 tons per year of any single Hazardous Air Pollutant (HAP) per calendar year; and,

g) 20 tons per year of any combination of HAP per calendar year.

Compliance with these emission limitations must be verified by pollutant-specific emission summaries for each calendar year except for VOC which must be verified for each consecutive twelve-month period. These emission summaries must be retained on-site for a minimum period of five (5) years; and, must be made available for review upon request by District, State or Federal personnel.

In addition, this facility is designated as a Major Source of PM10 under Regulation XIII - New Source Review, as it has a Potential to Emit in an amount equal to or greater than 15 tons per year of PM10; therefore, any new Permit Unit or any Modified Permit Unit at this facility must be fully offset pursuant to District Rule 1303(B).

10. A facility wide Comprehensive Emission Inventory Report (CEIR) for all emitted criteria and toxic air pollutants must be submitted to the District in a format approved by the District, upon District Request.
