Description:

DRY CLEANING consisting of: a Detrex Commander, model 8-90-11 with filter and water cooled recovery. This system is rate at 0.35 million Btu/h and 9.5 hp.

CONDITIONS:

1. The facility must have at least one trained operator. Attach a copy of the trained operator's certificate to the posted permit.
2. All leaks are to be reported on a Weekly Leak Inspection Checklist. Any liquid leak or vapor leak shall be repaired within 24 hours of detection. If a leak cannot be repaired within 48 hours the owner/operator shall notify the District by telephone or by fax.
3. Solvent and solvent waste will, at all times, be handled in a manner to preclude or minimize emissions of hydrocarbons into the air. Waste solvent/sludge will be maintained in sealed container until proper disposal is made. Contact San Bernardino County Environmental Health Services for further information pertaining to waste solvent/sludge disposal.
4. Change of type solvent from that cited in equipment description shall not be made without written approval from the District.
5. Refrigerated condensers shall be operated to ensure that exhaust gases are recirculated until the air-vapor stream temperature on the outlet side of the refrigerated condenser, downstream of any bypass, is less than or equal to 45 degrees F. (7.2 degrees C).

6. Primary control systems, other than refrigerated condensers, shall be operated to ensure that exhaust gases are recirculated until the perchloroethylene concentration in the drum is less than or equal to 8,600 ppmv or to the manufacturers limit - which ever is less, at the end of the drying cycle, before the machine door is opened and any fugitive control system activates.

7. The trained operator inspects the dry cleaning system at least once a week for liquid and vapor leaks using either a halogenated-hydrocarbon detector or a portable gas analyzer.

8. Records shall be kept approved District forms. The forms are: "POUNDS OF CLOTHES/LOAD", "OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE CHECKLIST", "WEEKLEY LEAK INSPECTION CHECKLIST", "ANNUAL REPORT", AND "SERVICE AND REPAIR LOG".

9. The dry cleaning machine must be a closed loop (dry to dry).

10. The dry cleaning machine must be a non-vent closed loop machine on or before October 1, 1998.
