ENGINE TEST STAND #4 consisting of:Test stand used for aircraft engine testing. Stationary RICE tested at a stationary RICE test cell/stand are exempt from the requirements of 40 CFR Part 63 Subpart ZZZZ pursuant to §63.6585.

CONDITIONS:

- 1. This equipment shall be installed, operated, and maintained in strict accord with those recommendations of the manufacturer/supplier and/or in a manner consistent with safety and good air pollution control practices for minimizing emissions. Unless otherwise noted, this equipment shall also be operated in accordance with all data and specifications submitted with the application for this permit. [District Rule 1302]
- 2.A non-resettable four-digit (9,999) hour timer shall be installed and maintained on this equipment to indicate elapsed engine operating time.

The owner/operator shall maintain an operations log for this equipment current and on-site (or at a central location) for a minimum of three (3) years, and this log shall be provided to District, State and/or Federal personnel, upon request. The log shall include, at a minimum, the information specified below:
- a. Date of each use and duration of each use (in hours);
- b. Aggregated daily and rolling 12 month fuel usage for each fuel type in gallons (all 10 stands); and,
- c. Maintenance performed on this equipment.

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- 4.Aggregated operation of all ten test stands at this facility shall not exceed the following rolling 12 month fuel usage limits:
- a. 22,800 gallons F-24; and, b. 16,000 gallons aviation gasoline. [District Rule 1320]
- 5. The entire facility shall not emit any of the Regulated Pollutants listed below in excess of the following limits in any consecutive 12 month period to remain below the USEPA's Synthetic Minor - 80% (SM-80) threshold:
- a. Oxides of Nitrogen (NOx): 20 tons per consecutive twelve (12) month period, measured as NO2:
- b. Oxides of Sulfur (SOx): 20 tons per consecutive twelve (12) month period;
- c. Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC): 20 tons per consecutive twelve (12) month period;
- d. Carbon Monoxide (CO): 80 tons per consecutive twelve (12) month period;
- e. Hydrogen Sulfide (H2S): 8 tons per consecutive twelve (12) month period;
- f. Lead (Pb): 0.48 tons per consecutive twelve (12) month period;
- q. Particulate Matter 10 microns and less (PM10): 14.5 tons per consecutive twelve (12) month period;
- h. Any single Hazardous Air Pollutant (HAP): 8 tons per consecutive twelve (12) month period; and,
- i. All HAPs combined: 20 tons per consecutive twelve (12) month period.

Compliance with these limits shall be demonstrated through the submission of a facility-wide Comprehensive Emission Inventory (CEI) for all emitted Regulated Air Pollutants. Exceedance of these emission limits may trigger offsets, BACT, National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP), and/or require submission of a Title V permit application. [District Rules 1302 and 1303]

6.A facility wide Comprehensive Emission Inventory (CEI) for all emitted criteria and toxic air pollutants must be submitted to the District, in a format approved by the District, upon District request.
