Note: Visible emission observations shall be conducted in accordance with the requirements set forth in USEPA Method 22.

3.This equipment must be operated such that no visible fugitive dust is visible in the atmosphere beyond the property line of the facility at which this equipment is operating.

4.The o/o shall maintain a record of repairs and maintenance on this equipment and submit it to the District on request. The record shall be retained for a minimum of two (2) years, and this log shall be provided to District, State and Federal personnel upon request.
