#### **Description:**

DUST COLLECTOR (BLDG B) consisting of: A Torit HP Series #96PT8 baghouse, with 96 8' L by 15" D 16 oz. polyester bags totalling 954 square feet of filter area, equipped with a 60 hp fan producing 8100 cfm of flow at 10" water column (for an air to cloth ratio of 8.5:1). This device serves the Paint Mixing and Filling Equipment line under permit B002239.

#### **CONDITIONS:**

1. The owner/operator shall install, operate and maintain this dust collector in strict accord with those recommendations of the manufacturer/supplier, and sound engineering principles which produce minimum emissions of air contaminants.

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2. The owner/operator shall institute a program of maintenance which includes at a minimum monthly visual inspections of all associated equipment (inclusive of the filters and their suspension systems).

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3. The owner/operator shall log all the items in 2 above in addition to the cartridge replacements, repairs and non-scheduled

4.The owner/operator shall maintain an inventory of replacement bags on-site at all times which will ensure compliance with applicable Rules of District Regulation IV.

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5.This baghouse shall discharge no more than 0.69 lb/hour at a maximum concentration of 0.01 gr/dSCF at the operating conditions described in the above description.

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6.This equipment does not require a regularly scheduled emission compliance test. However, emission compliance testing may be required at the discretion of the District.

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7.Emissions from this facility shall not exceed:

- a. 12 tons/year of PM10, based on a rolling twelve month basis; and
  - b. 1,190 pounds of VOC emissions per month, based on a rolling twelve-month basis; and
  - c. 8 tons per year for any single HAP and 20 tons per year for any combination of HAPs, calculated on a rolling twelve-month basis. HAPs defined in Section 112(b) of the Federal Clean Air Act, see <http://www.epa.gov/ttn/atw/orig189.html>).

This log shall demonstrate compliance with the VOC limit and the HAP limit designated in condition 7, using a District-approved method, with at least the last two years of monthly emissions summaries maintained for a minimum of two years and provided to District, State or Federal personnel upon request.

9.A facility wide Comprehensive Emission Inventory (CEI) for all emitted criteria and toxic air pollutants must be submitted to the District, in a format approved by the District, upon District request.
