Description:

CEMENT STORAGE SILO consisting of: 2,520 gallon capacity, served by a Liddel bin vent, Model PJC-305, pulse jet type, having eight (8) cartridge type filters each measuring 8" x 40". Equipment elevation is 3323 feet above sea level. Permit modified 3/9/21 with baghouse replacement for bin vent.

CONDITIONS:

1. The storage silos and associated air pollution control device shall be installed, operated and maintained in strict accord with those recommendations of the manufacturer/supplier and/or sound engineering principles which produce the minimum emissions of contaminants. Unless otherwise noted, this equipment shall also be operated in accordance with all data and specifications submitted with the application for this permit.

2. This equipment shall not be operated unless it is vented through the dedicated bin vent when accepting pneumatic fill.

[District Rule 204 and 1303]

3. The storage silos' including the air pollution control device, must be operated such that no visible emissions from the equipment result in an opacity greater than 20 percent on the Ringelmann Chart for a period or periods aggregating more than three (3) minutes in any one hour.

4. The owner/operator shall conduct a minimum program of inspection and maintenance on this equipment. The owner/operator shall maintain current and on-site for two (2) years a log of the following information, which shall be provided to District personnel upon request:

a. Weekly Visible Emission Determination (VED) using the following procedures:

1. Ensure that the observer's back is to the sun or artificial light.
2. The observation spot provides a clear view of the emission point(s).
3. Observe the emission point(s) for a period of one minute.
4. Designate the emission point(s) as "dusting" or "not dusting". If "dusting" is occurring, owner/operator must conduct a Visible Emission Evaluation using USEPA Method 22, and USEPA Method 9, on each dusting emission point if necessary, or shut down the equipment immediately and effect the required equipment repairs.
5. Log the results of these observations; include the date and times that the observations were conducted; provide these logs to District personnel upon request.

b. Date and result of annual cartridge and cartridge support system inspection;

c. Date of cartridge replacements; and,

d. Date and nature of any system repairs.

5. The o/o shall maintain on-site a minimum inventory of replacement filter cartridges that assures compliance with these conditions.

6. A facility wide Comprehensive Emission Inventory (CEI) for all emitted criteria and toxic air pollutants must be submitted to the District, in a format approved by the District, upon District request.
