Description:

SOIL VAPOR EXTRACTION/TREATMENT SYSTEM consisting of: King/Buck Hasstech Oxidizers at 100 acfm; Thermal Oxidizer; Catalytic; ancillary piping and electrical as necessary. The thermal oxidizer is used when total hydrocarbon, THC, in the influent gas 3 2500 ppm v/v. The catalytic oxidizer is used when the THC is less than or equal to 35% of the Lower Explosive Limit (LEL), volume, of the incoming gas mixture.

CONDITIONS:

1. Operation of this equipment shall be in strict accord with all information submitted with the application for this permit unless specifically exempted hereunder.
2. This District shall be notified in writing and by telephone no less than 10 days prior to start-up of this equipment anywhere in this District.
3. During these operations, determinations for TPH as hexane shall be made using a flame ionization detector (FID) or other method which this District finds equivalent.
4. Eight consecutive hourly emissions determinations shall be made by FID on both the first and second days of operation. The first day determinations shall commence within 30 minutes of start-up. Results of these first days' determinations shall be dispatched to the District within 10 days. Subsequent to these initial determinations, monitoring may be reduced to monthly, in conjunction with bag samples and analyses according to EPA Methods 8015 (modified) and 8020, until completion of the project.

5. Emissions determinations by FID shall be measured at both the inlet and outlet of the combustor/catalytic oxidizer.

6. The use of FID shall be considered invalid if not calibrated daily with a known concentration of the selected gas.

7. Items which are required to be logged are as follows:

A. Flow rate, SCFM;

B. Temperature of combustor/catalytic oxidizer, degrees F.

C. All items above in 3 through and including 6, and with the same frequency noted in 4 above.

8. Where determinations and/or logs are required to be kept, this District shall have final approval of the format selected. All logs shall be kept current, on-site for the duration of the project and provided to District personnel on request. Within 45 days of removal of the equipment from the present site, the owner/operator shall provide all the data delineated above in the form of a summary report.
