Description:

SOLVENT SPRAY BOOTH - PORTABLE consisting of: Sande Equipment Company cart mounted custom unit #1 with a Cat 280 two hp triplex pump, solvent supply system manifold, nozzles of various sizes ranging from 0 to 120 degrees, and a bypass system with a five gallon overflow tank.

CONDITIONS:

1. This equipment shall not be operated unless the item or items being cleaned are inside an enclosure designed to collect excess liquids and excess liquids shall be either recycled or properly disposed of in accordance with all applicable rules and regulations.
2. This equipment is portable and can be used on equipment owned and/or operated by MWD at other various MWD sites throughout the District. The equipment will be stored at the Gene Pumping Station when not in use.
3. The total amount of photochemically reactive organic solvents that can be released by this facility to the atmosphere shall not exceed 39.6 lb/day. However, 1,1,1 trichloroethane is the only solvent that is exempt from this condition.
4. The total amount of non-photochemically reactive organic solvents that can be released by this facility to the atmosphere shall not exceed 250 lb/day. However, 1,1,1 trichloroethane is the only solvent that is exempt from this condition.
5. The total amount of organic solvents that can be released by this facility to the atmosphere shall not exceed 250 lb/day. However, 1,1,1 trichloroethane is the only solvent that is exempt from this condition.

6.A daily solvent usage log shall be maintained for each permit unit that uses and/or releases organic solvents. This log shall contain, as a minimum, the date, hours operated, material and amount used on a daily basis.

7.A daily solvent emission report shall be prepared using the information from the above logs. This report shall contain hours operated, material and amount used, solvent content of each material used, whether the solvent is reactive or non-reactive, total daily amount of reactive or non-reactive emissions by material and facility-wide. This report shall be prepared at least once per month.

8.The logs and reports shall be maintained on-site for at least two (2) years and made available to District personnel upon request.

9.The owner/operator (o/o) shall comply with all applicable Rules and Regulations of the District.

10.This equipment shall only be operated/maintained in strict accord with manufacturer's/supplier's recommendations and/or sound engineering principles.

11.The o/o shall notify the District Engineering Section in writing at least 10 working days before using any solvent(s) other than EPA 2000.
